Applying to Cambridge Friends School

1. Fill out an Inquiry Form online at www.cambridgefriendsschool.org
2. Schedule a family interview
3. You will receive a log-in and password for "My CFS."

There, you will find your application checklist:

- Complete the online application
- Submit the \$50 application fee
- Work with the Admission office to schedule a virtual student meeting
- Permission for Release of Records (if required by sending school)
- School records from 2020-2021 year
- School records from 2021-2022 year (first marking period)
- AISNE recommendation forms according to applicant's grade level
- Last Year's Teacher or School Director Recommendation
- Student Questionnaire (middle school applicants only)
- Any educational testing the applicant has completed

Steps to Complete the Online Parent Financial Statement (PFS)

1. The Parent Financial Statement (PFS) for the 2022-2023 school year will be available October 1, 2021
2. Go to sssbynais.force.com/familyportal
3. Set up a PFS online account using your email address and a password
4. Submit and pay for the PFS by January 15, 2022. Cambridge Friends School's code is 2014. The application fee of \$51 is nonrefundable
5. Upload the required documents by February 4, 2022 by clicking on the "Manage Documents" tab, then "Browse" to locate the document on your computer, then click on "Upload"
Required documents include: 2021 W-2 Statements and 2021 1040 tax forms
6. Financial aid decisions will be released the same day as admission decisions on March 10-11, 2022
7. Submit 2021 tax forms by April 15, 2022. CFS will use these forms to verify your information and finalize your financial aid award
